In collaboration with and under the supervision of the Education and Formation Committee, the DCE will design, implement and maintain all Christian Education ministry initiatives. Through contact ministry, programs, and activities, they will work to foster inter-generational relationships and encourage connections inside and outside our congregation. The DCE will also be in charge of the following:

- Coordinate the weekly, monthly, and annual operation of the children, youth, and adult Sunday School programs, choosing curriculum, and ordering necessary supplies and equipment.
- Maintain and organize any physical church spaces used in connection with education and formation.
- Plan and lead retreats and mission trips for youth, laying a foundation of faith that carries them into adulthood.

- Coordinate with the Mission and Justice Committee to encourage local, regional, national, and international partnerships and ministries of the church, including children and youth whenever possible.
- Effectively communicate with the parents of children and youth, the Pastor, the congregation as a whole, preschool, and the community using all available platforms. This includes responsibility for the weekly youth and families newsletter.

Our vision is to be a leading, faithful, witnessing, diverse, and growing community of God's people.

- 1. *Leading*: Our leadership tradition commits us to meeting the everchanging needs of our community.
- 2. Faithful: Our life together centers on vibrant worship as a dynamic faith community, reformed and always reforming. We strive to faithfully manage God's gifts.
- 3. Witnessing: Through compassionate service and justice work, we witness our hope in Jesus Christ to our neighbors.
- 4. *Diverse*: We unconditionally welcome all people in the manner of our Lord and Savior.
- 5. *Growing*: We seek spiritual growth for all through prayer, Scripture study, and sharing our faith journey.

How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

Our leadership has served the church and community for 114 years. We have birthed eight sister congregations. We co-founded City Kids, Caritas, Family Promise, and Resurrection House. We continue to support Rise Against Hunger, All Faiths Food Bank, S.U.R.E. (Sarasota United for Responsibility and Equity), Beth-El Farmworker Ministry, Mision Peniel, Invest in Children at Brentwood Elementary School, Coalition of Immokalee Workers, Cedarkirk, and Thornwell Home for Children. We celebrate interfaith worship services and host an inter-racial book club. Our global missions are a Cuba Partnership and Nicaragua/CEPAD.

We celebrate at one contemporary and one traditional Sunday Service. Our music program features the FPC Choir, New Song Band, Handbell Choir, and Oak Street Stage performances.

What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

First Presbyterian Church is committed to Christ and to meeting the evolving needs of our community. The passion of this congregation for outreach is exemplified by its continued support of our many missions, even when we could not gather and were working through a leadership transition.

In 2020, FPC held food and supply drives for residents of Newtown, a nearby economically disadvantaged community, and for Beth-El. We support All Faiths Food Bank through donations, volunteers, and the use of our campus for distribution. These programs are a direct response to growing community needs.

FPC is a member of SURE (Sarasota United for Responsibility and Equity) whose mission is to unite people of faith in holding community systems accountable to Godly standards in criminal justice, affordable housing, and restorative practices. Mentoring and support for children at a local Title I elementary school is provided by 35 FPC volunteers. We support Cedarkirk, Camp and Conference Center which leverages the support of two presbyteries to provide summer camps and program space for

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charities serving underprivileged children and adults. In late 2020, we resumed partnership with Family Promise, helping temporarily homeless families transition to self-sufficiency.

In large part, our outreach is focused on families. We see the Director of Christian Education integrating the youth and family ministry into established programs and bringing initiative and passion to create new avenues of outreach.

How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

This call will provide much-needed help and support with our programs and ministries to children, youth, and adults. Up until three years ago, we had a full-time associate pastor who oversaw the educational and formational ministries of the church. Now most of that work is falling on volunteer members of the committee. We need a dedicated and trained educator to guide us in putting together and sustaining a program of intentional faith formation for disciples of all ages and stages of faith. We also need someone to serve as staff liaison/bridge-builder with our preschool board and Mission and Justice Committee.

The Director of Christian Education will need a set of personal attributes, skills, and background qualifications that complement our congregation's values and enhance the mission of FPC of Sarasota. This individual should be enthusiastic, faithful, and have a passion for building community. They'll need to be self-motivated, organized, compassionate, and creative with a willingness to collaborate. The DCE will offer a thoughtful approach to equipping families and volunteer leaders to be faith supporters in their roles. This person must be reliable, patient, and take

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the time to listen to staff and congregation members. Key to the position is the ability to attract, engage, and inspire people of varying ages and backgrounds to learn and grow in their faith. Additionally, applicants to the position of DCE must have a 4-year college degree and, preferably, a CE concentration certification. This individual should have 5+ years of Church leadership experience. Their personal theology and core values should align with the vision and mission of both the Presbyterian Church (USA) and FPC Sarasota. The DCE must possess excellent communication skills, both written and verbal, and demonstrate proficiency with social media, technology, and standard office software programs.
